Finally, in the third phase, we will encourage students to embrace the new technology in their classrooms and allow students to complete their assignments and follow along with the ever-advancing classroom with the resources they have been provided. The project plan could be fully executed and functional by the upcoming fall semester if started before the beginning of summer. The implementation of classroom student-use computers will have long term lasting effects on the students at Clemson university that cant afford a laptop or provide for a student that may have simply forgot his or her laptop at home.

The total budget for this project is \$75,000, which will cover the cost of purchasing and installing the computers, software, and hardware upgrades. The Clemson Education Initiative will provide funding to support this implementation.
